

Condemning Oppression & Restraint In Conflict.

Prophet Muhammad (SAW) has been reported as saying: "O son of Adam! Do what is good and give up what is evil! Injustice is of three kinds. The first is the injustice that is not forgiven, like associating anything with God. In this relation, God has said: "Surely Allah does not forgive that anything should be associated with Him. (4:48)" Second, the injustice which is forgiven is like the injustice one does against himself. Third, it is the injustice which is not forgiven, like the injustice which one does to another one." Injustices run rampant at all levels. However, for the believer, injustices committed against another person may make a person more distraught, knowing that they cannot be forgiven unless the person who was inflicted forgives. Believers are even more apprehensive to cause transgressions when they are constantly aware that the Almighty Creator is ever present and vigilant, as stated in Chapter 2, verse 225 of the Holy Qur'an. "Allah! There is no deity except Him, the Ever-Living, the Sustainer of [all] existence. Neither drowsiness overtakes Him nor sleep. To Him belongs whatever is in the heavens and whatever is on the earth. Who is it that can intercede with Him except by His permission? He knows what is [presently] before them and what will be after them, and they encompass not a thing of His knowledge except for what He wills. .. "(2:255)

Therefore, for these reasons, and more, the interaction between two individuals must be met with harmony and mutual trust. Even in one's absence, it is unlawful to oppress another be it through sins such as backbiting, slander, theft, etc. They too, are unforgivable actions when committed, unless one is redeemed through forgiveness. Yet, to go so far as taking the lives of innocent people is a crime of humanity. Almighty Allah states in the Holy Quran: "That is why We decreed for the Children of Israel that whoever kills a soul, without [its being guilty of] manslaughter or corruption on the earth, it is as though he had killed all mankind...(5:32).


The crimes that the world is witnessing in Palestine, Lebanon, and other parts of the globe are unimaginable. Homicide, genocide, infanticide, and every other type of annihilation have occurred since the creation of man and continue to persist. It is not only reprehensible but horrific. What is more incredulous is not only the support that the superpowers are giving, which is enabling the oppressor but also from those who label themselves as believers of Islam. Prophet Muhammad (S) also stated, "If one knowingly goes to help an oppressor, he has apostatized from Islam." The Almighty Lord stated clearly in the Quran in Chapter 11, verse 113: "And do not incline to those who are unjust." Prophet Muhammad (S) was sent as a mercy to mankind, which he exemplified through his actions in times of war and peace. The wars that the Holy Prophet (S) fought were defensive, by which, he abided by humanitarian decrees as dictated by Islam. Prophet Muhammad (S) instructed his soldiers the following directives:

- 1 Do not kill any child, any woman, or any elderly or sick person.
- 2. Do not practice treachery or mutilation.
- 3. Do not uproot or burn palms or cut down fruitful trees
- 4. Do not slaughter a sheep, a cow, or a camel, except for food.
- 5. If one fights his brother, [he must] avoid striking the face, for God created him in the image of Adam.
- Do not kill the monks in monasteries, and do not kill those sitting in places of worship.
- 7. Do not destroy the villages and towns, do not spoil the cultivated fields and gardens,
- and do not slaughter the cattle.
- 8. Do not wish for an encounter with the enemy; pray to God to grant you security, but
- when you [are forced to] encounter them, exercise patience.
- 9. No one may punish with fire except the Lord of Fire.
- Accustom yourselves to do good if people do good, and do no wrong even if they commit evil.

Combat is never good, but when faced with circumstances that compel one to battle, showing restraint against conflict is noble. The Holy Qur'an testifies that ultimately the righteous will prevail in chapter 6, verse 21: "...surely the unjust will not be successful." (6:21). These words of hope from the Master of the Universe only reiterate what the Lord Almighty has proclaimed when dealing with oppressors. Prophet Muhammad (SAW) relates: "Allah the Almighty says: My wrath is great against one who does injustice to someone who has no helper other than me."

Prophet Muhammad (P) Palestine:

A Cry For Justice

With the tragic death toll in Gaza surpassing 40,000, mostly women and children, and four months of relentless Israeli attacks, this week's Friday sermon focused on the pressing issue of oppression and injustice. There needs to be an unwavering vigilance against oppression in all aspects of life, & we need to draw inspiration from numerous verses in the Quran and the teachings of Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him).

Scholars define oppression (zulm) as displacing something from its rightful position, whether by lacking what is due or going beyond bounds. This encompasses a multitude of manifestations, all centered around the fundamental notion of placing something where it does not belong.

Oppression, often starting small, can accumulate over time, leading to societal destruction and even civilizational collapse. This principle is evident throughout the Quran and Prophetic tradition. Allah Almighty states:

'And your Lord [O Prophet] would never destroy a society unjustly while its people were acting rightly. (Surah Hud 11:117)

This clarifies that if people are standing up to injustices and oppression, Allah will not destroy them. When oppression spreads and people remain silent or accept it, total ruin may befall society, as was the case with past civilizations.

Furthermore, Allah, the Omnipotent warns:

& "Beware of a trial that will not only affect the wrongdoers among you." (Surah Al-Anfal8:25)

The exegetes explain regarding this verse that previous nations were wiped out because they tolerated oppression and evil until it was rampant, with none speaking out.

The Prophet (peace be upon him) confirmed in an authentic narration that Allah, The Creator, can collectively punish all people for the sins of some people if transgression against the Almighty becomes widespread. The spread of oppression and the fate of a community are interconnected.

The Quran teaches us that oppression slowly weakens society and can eventually lead to its downfall if unchallenged.



Injustice not only inflicts suffering on the victims but alsoscars the entire community. The Quran stresses the importance of addressing oppression at its roots and preventing its proliferation in society.

Inner reflection is also needed to reflect upon oppression in one's personal life and society. Congregations and societies must be vigilant of their complicity in injustices through their silence and inaction. There are two primary types of oppression that one must be mindful of Oppression against Allah, the Highest: As mentioned in the Quran, when Luqman advises his son. "O my son, do not associate [anything] with Allah. Indeed, association [with him] is agreat injustice (zulm)." (Surah Luqman 31:13)

Mistreatment between people. This is seen in how we interact with children, spouses, colleagues, and strangers. When we mistreat others, it leads to various problems in our community, including broken families resulting from our oppressive actions and those of others around us.

When people tolerate oppression both within their communities and from externalsources, inadvertently it facilitates its most extreme forms, as evidenced by the appalling crimes committed against innocent individuals today. The killing of Palestinians underscores the urgent need to courageously speak out against oppression and challenge injustice at its source.

Everyone has a responsibility to firstly, address the injustices we perpetrate and secondly, to stand up to the oppression we see around us. Moving forward, all people must uphold the rights others have with each other with honesty, and advocate justice for those who are oppressed.

The horrific oppression that the Palestinian brothers and sisters face today is but the latest example of the oppression that the ummah has suffered. Their suffering is a reminder of the time of the invasion of the Tartars, when the Mongols swept through Baghdad and other Muslim lands, massacring people and destroying homes, libraries, and mosques indiscriminately. Despite the devastation, such tragedies have historically strengthened our faith and united the Muslim Ummah.

While parts of society weep at the suffering of the Palestinians today, the consciousness always needs to be awoken to visibly examine the shortcomings within each self and remain vigilant that individuals do not become the sources of greater oppression within the ummah.

The brothers and sisters in Palestine and across the world have a right for humanity to honor them through far more than just sorrow and tears. The real battle against oppression begins with self-reflection and accountability. Their political liberation is inextricably bound to everyone's spiritual growth.

Prophet Muhammad:

He declared: "By Allah, if Fatimah, the daughter of Muhammad, were to steal, I would have her hand cut off." This statement underscored his firm belief in the principle of justice, irrespective of social status or kinship. demonstrating that no one is above the law. His actions conveyed the profound message that justice should be blind to wealth, power, or privilege, and should be administered fairly to all members of society.


Reflection and Action: Living by His Example

The Prophet even pardoned his enemies when he had the power to punish, such as Wahshi the man who killed his beloved uncle, among many others. If humanity were only to study and implement the many aspects of the life of the final beloved Messenger of God, the world would be in a different state.
